About the team

The Reviews and System Capability business group serves as an integrated, professional, and thought-leading advisory group to the government. The business group is responsible for strategically and operationally leading key programmes of work by:

- Uplifting regulatory system capability using a variety of interventions and mechanisms; and
- Improving regulation and regulatory systems by undertaking targeted reviews of varying scope and scale.



About the role

The Reviews and System Capability group manages a pipeline of work where project teams are assembled from across the business group based on the scope and scale of each piece of work, ensuring a blend of skills and expertise is brought together as needed.

The Senior Advisor is responsible for supporting regulatory reviews and/or capability-building activities within an operating model where expertise may be drawn from across the group.

Under the guidance of the Lead and Principal advisers, the Senior Advisor will contribute to the Ministry's broader initiatives, approaches and strategies, as well as mentoring/developing other team members.

As a small and agile Ministry, the Senior Advisor will be expected to contribute to other work priorities and tasks as needed.

The individual's specific responsibilities and focus will evolve over time to align with the Ministry's and the Minister for Regulation's changing priorities.

About you

- Experience in regulatory policy, economics, operational policy or regulatory operations
- Sound critical thinking, reasoning, and judgement, with the ability to apply this in a policy or regulatory context
- Strong written and verbal communication skills, along with numerical and/or data literacy, with the ability to communicate issues and concepts clearly and concisely
- Ability to work independently within established boundaries, support the work and development of advisers, escalate issues and opportunities as needed, and adapt quickly to changing circumstances
- Ability to identify the best process and/or framework to achieve the outcome sought
- Personal integrity, sound judgment, and a commitment to honesty and ethical conduct
- Good relationship building and listening skills, and political nous including the ability to understand the different perspectives and dynamics of all the actors in a regulatory system
- Good understanding of the public sector, including how agencies work, and the broader machinery of government
- Demonstrated experience in advising and supporting people at all levels of an organisation.

Reviews and System Capability	 Depending on their focus area, the Senior Advisor may be expected to: Support regulatory reviews and/or capability-building activities from initiation through to completion and evaluation Undertake research and analysis, contribute to innovative, practical and durable recommendations, and prepare advice or guidance Take the lead in delivering and/or project managing specific tasks, including providing daily support and coaching to team members involved in the projects Contribute to projects where others are accountable for delivering a series of related outputs Support the delivery of workshops and other engagements with a diverse range of stakeholders, ensuring events are productive and outcomes focussed Assist in developing and implementing strategies to understand and enhance regulator performance Provide input into Cabinet papers, briefings, Ministerial correspondence, Official Information Act requests, parliamentary questions and other ad hoc requests from Ministers.
Stakeholder Engagement	Foster strong working relationships with internal and external stakeholders, including government departments, agencies, and community groups.
Risk management	Work on a "no surprises" basis and ensure the Head of Ministerial Services is kept well informed of progress, issues and risks.

The responsibilities of this position are anticipated to evolve as the Ministry addresses shifting needs. The incumbent will need to remain flexible and adaptable, developing in response to these changes.
