### **Workforce and Recruitment Update**

Recruitment activity remains busy with 19 positions being actively recruited. We have filled 38 (42%) of our permanent positions.

The Chief Economist advert closed on 13 October and we are currently shortlisting. Interest was high with a total of 61 applications. Following preliminary conversations with candidates, we expect formal interviews to be conducted between 28 October – 3 November.

### **Early Childhood Education Regulatory Review**

#### For information

The Early Childhood Education Sector Regulatory Review continues to analyse and test initial findings and recommendations with the Ministry of Education, Education Review Office, Ministry of Health and Ministry for Primary Industries regulatory subject matter experts. The purpose of testing is to:

- Understand the level of agreement on our findings and recommendations.
- Document where there is disagreement on our findings and recommendations.
- Confirm where additional information is required.
- Describe the implications of our recommendations, including risks and trade-offs.
- Discuss the cost and time required for implementation.

To date, we have held 11 testing workshops covering regulatory monitoring, regulatory capability and performance, licencing criteria (multiple workshops), regulatory tools, curriculum, qualifications and ratios, regulatory strategy, approach, culture and leadership.

Our follow up visits to Te Kohanga Reo, Puna Reo and Pacific Peoples centres have now been completed.

This week we have provided you with our initial findings on licencing criteria.
