### **Updates**

#### **Early Childhood Education Regulatory Review**

For information

The Early Childhood Education Sector Regulatory Review continues to analyse and test initial findings and recommendations.

To date, we have held 13 testing workshops covering regulatory monitoring, regulatory capability and performance, licencing criteria (multiple workshops), regulatory tools, curriculum, qualifications and ratios, regulatory strategy, approach, culture and leadership.

Initial findings from testing workshops were provided to the ECE Regulatory Review Steering Group (the Steering Group) on the 21 of October as part of the cross-agency consultation process. We are considering feedback from the Steering Group members on these findings. We will be presenting initial recommendations to the Steering Group on 5 November.

Our next briefing will be delivered on 14 November and will share initial findings and recommendations, including an update on the second tranche of licensing criteria. Work on the report is progressing well, we will present you with a final draft report for your consideration on 13 December.

As discussed we intend to proactive release the following briefings and reports on 31 October:

- MFR 2024-121 Early Childhood Education Regulatory System Review: Themes from direct engagement
- MFR 2024-129 Early Childhood Education Regulatory Review analysis of themes from submissions

We provided feedback to the Ministry of Education on the draft Cabinet paper proposed changes to the educator qualification and person responsible requirements in licensed home-based ECE services and the accompanying Regulatory Impact Statement (RIS).

#### **Agricultural and Horticultural Products Regulatory Review**

For information

The current focus for the Agricultural and Horticultural Review team is testing our preliminary findings for the issues and causes work and draft recommendations with Ministry for Primary Industries, New Zealand Food Safety, the Environmental Protection Authority, and the Ministry for the Environment. We have received significant feedback from agencies which we are working through and considering.

Next week we will be engaging with the Sector Reference Group and undertaking bespoke engagement with the Office of the Parliamentary Commissioner for the Environment, Fonterra,

Zespri, and AgrizeroNZ. Engagement with these groups will be focused on a high-level overview of options that have been considered (including those we are not progressing), and more detail on options likely to be of relevance to their specific interests. The Senior Officials Advisory Group will also be meeting next week to discuss the upcoming briefing to Joint Ministers, and the preliminary findings of the review.

#### **Good regulatory practice guidance – launch of six Quick Guides**

On Wednesday 16 October, the Ministry hosted a webinar to launch six <u>Quick Guides</u> on regulatory practice essentials. The webinar was attended by 165 people. A panel discussion on the importance of the guides featured Gráinne Moss and Lisa Docherty (MfR), Vanessa Horne (Commerce Commission) and Steve Watson (MBIE). The discussion particularly highlighted the critical importance of good quality communication and engagement with regulated parties and the public, and praise for the Ministry's guides on these topics.

A further four Quick Guides are in development for launch early next year. In the development of the Ministry for Regulation Weekly Report Page **5** of **10**MFR2024-147

Quick Guides the Regulatory System Capability team draws on around 60 subject matter experts from over a dozen agencies to synthesise the best content, examples and provide peer review. Each written Quick Guide will have a companion online learning module. The modules will add examples, scenarios and interactive learning activities about the topics. The first six modules will be launched in November on the Ministry's new learning management system available to people who do regulatory work in central and local government.

Findings from the two open regulatory reviews are highlighting the importance of good practice as key to good regulation. The Ministry is preparing further good regulatory practice guidance alongside the quick guides and modules, aimed at supporting regulatory leaders to lead good practice in their agencies.


